2021 AWARDEES



2021 Global Perspectives Awardee Ginea Briggs is an educator at School Without Walls. Through her career dedicated to global education and changemaking, Ginea has been instrumental in shaping LearnServe's learning, and the learning of countless students about cross-cultural understanding. At School Without Walls, she sponsors the BOMB Squad (the Hip Hop dance team), the SASS Club (Sister Action, Sister Strength) sponsored by the DC Rape Crisis Center, and the National Honor Society. In 2015, Ginea spent four months in Hyderabad, India as a Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching Recipient. There she studied school communities and their effects on girls and self-esteem.



2021 Entrepreneurship Awardee Malachi Byrd is a rapper, poet, scholar, and changemaker. Whether speaking out about educational equity, gentrification, or police brutality, Malachi is committed to the battle against anti-Blackness. From his African-American studies degree and Creative Writing certificate to being selected as Washington D.C.'s inaugural youth poet laureate (2015) to publishing his book and mixtape, *Crowning Too Early* (2017), he displays in his artwork where his research interests lie: fully interrogating the evaporation of Black childhood. With the proceeds from *Crowning Too Early* he has launched a scholarship fund to support creative and academic endeavors of rising artists.



2021 Civic Champion Awardee The Catalogue for Philanthropy is

the region's only locally-focused guide to giving and volunteering. Their goal is to create visibility for community nonprofits, fuel their growth with philanthropic dollars, and create a movement for social good in our region. Since 2003, the Catalogue has raised more than \$45 million for their network of vetted nonprofits. At LearnServe, youth are the leaders of today. We empower youth changemakers to process the real issues they encounter, find their unique purpose, and take action in their own communities. Through social entrepreneurship and global education programs, during the school year and over the summer, we channel our students' passion into agency.

LEARNSERVE FELLOWS identify social issues, then design and launch ventures to tackle them in their own communities.

In the **LEARNSERVE INCUBATOR**, youth maximize the impact of their social ventures through field testing and human-centered design.

Our <u>GLOBAL SUMMER FELLOWSHIP</u> connects young changemakers from Zambia, South Africa, Paraguay, and the US for social entrepreneurship training and international exchange.

FAST FACTS

- LearnServe has served 2,500+ students since 2003.
- Our students and alumni represent a diverse network of more than 50 public, independent, and charter middle and high schools in DC, Maryland, and Virginia. In 2020, students from Michigan and Pennsylvania joined us.
- 84% of alumni state that LearnServe empowered them to take action beyond our programs.
- 62% of our students remain civically engaged after LearnServe, over half of them serving in leadership roles.
- 4,000+ individuals have engaged in youth-led social change through LearnServe students over the past 18 years.




